Rules Liberalized for Veterans with Undiagnosed Illnesses, Application Window Extended for Five Years

Veterans of the Persian Gulf War with undiagnosed illness have an additional five (5) years to qualify for benefits.

A recent change in the VA regulations affects Veterans of the conflict in South-west Asia. Many have attributed a range of undiagnosed or poorly understood medical problems to their military services. Chemical weapons, environmental hazards and vaccinations are among the possible causes.

Under long standing VA rules, any undiagnosed illnesses used to established eligibility for VA benefits must become apparent by December 31,2011. The new



change pushes the date back to DECEMBER 31, 2016.

Veterans or survivors who believe they qualify for the benefits should contact VA at 1-800-827-1000 or your Department Service Office.

Homelessness among Veterans Declines 12% in 2011

The Department of VA and Housing and urban Development announced that homelessness among Veterans was reduced by 12% between January 2010 and January 2011.

According to the 2011 report, 67,495 Veterans were homeless in the U.S. on a single night in January 2011, a significant reduction from last year 2010 single night count of 76,329.

PROMOTE SOCIAL NETWORKING

Facebook, LinkedIn, Twitter, MySpace, social networking, texting, instant messaging, video messaging, blogging – these are all amazing tools that the American workforce and millions of people use naturally, as part of their everyday lives. Yet, we as members of the American Legion Auxiliary are just beginning to scratch the surface.

In today's world of budget cuts, falling dollar value and limited not for profit dollars, Facebook gives members another way to connect with each other for quick, yet pertinent information about the Auxiliary's Mission. Facebook is "free" - no printing, no stamps just instant communication!

Facebook can be used to share photos, upcoming events, information, videos and links to causes that are related to our mission. Most importantly, members of these groups can exchange

ideas and success stories or just stay in touch with each other.

How to get started? Recruit a member of your unit that is computer literate, or just get one of your junior members to show you how to form your group. Each group must be attached to a profile - that being a registered user. When setting up the page, it is advised as a precautionary measure, to have more than one administrator (that means more than one person who controls the content of the group page.) Then, check out other ALA Units, Junior groups, or Departments to see what they have done.

Tips for a successful ALA Facebook group:

There is a difference between a group and a page. Groups are good for small scale organizing, while Pages are used for a more public presence.

In the settings, you will want to be an "open" group. New members can join instantly and can see all the parts of your group.

Include contact information for your Unit or Department - not the administrators.

Check Facebook privacy settings thoroughly, check settings for settings for web and apps connected to Facebook regularly and consider what you are sharing.

Use the Auxiliary's published mission statement for the group's description, adding information unique to your unit or department.

Always check spelling and grammar. Ask another member to "proof" the site and make corrections immediately.

Invite the Legion Family to join. Once you have the group established

and ready to "debut," invite your own Legion Family friends to join the group. Encourage them to invite their Legion Family friends to join as well. That's why it's called "social networking."

Incorporate events - It's a great way to remind your members of upcoming meetings or activities. Events will show up on each member's personal Profile page as it nears its date.

When you start to write in the "write something" tab on the Group wall, you get options to add links, photos, videos, etc. Use these options to enhance your message.

Message all members from time to time. You can keep everyone updated on what's going on with your group with a simple message. You may also use this tool to remind group mem-
